| | Where possible turn off your cooker or oven. |
| | Where possible close windows and doors, especially the front door . |
| | Do not attempt to put out the fire. |
| | Do not put yourself at risk. |
| | Leave the building by the nearest available escape route. |
| | Do not use the lift. |
| | Activate a fire alarm call point. |
| | Exit the building and move to a safe area outside, away from the building. |
| | Call the fire service by dialling 999 or 112. |
