|  | Do not attempt to put out the fire.  |
|  | Do not put yourself at risk.   |
|  | Leave the building by the nearest available exit and move a safe distance                                    |
|  | from the building.   |
|  | Do not use the lift.   |
|  | Call the fire service by dialling 999 or 112.  |
